The Pasifika Futures Conference 2017 Evaluation¹

31st July to 1st August

Key Findings

- 88% were satisfied with the conference experience, with 50% being very satisfied
- 65% are promoters of our event, scoring us 9 or 10 out of 10
- Our net promoter score for the conference was 62, higher than the global benchmark of 51
- Participants gained insight into the value and impact of sharing and responding to story; into the importance of relationships and the value of the learning circle.

1. The value and impact of sharing and responding to story.

The importance, power and strength of listening to, responding and sharing story. Participants described the stories from both the leaders and families as inspirational, enhancing knowledge and understanding of families and Pacific peoples and leaders struggles, resilience and journeys to wellness and prosperity.

2. The importance of relationships and how sharing story can enhance connection, knowledge and relationships.

Another key insight was that effective relationships are central to whanau ora – both with families, with other partners working in whanau ora and with teams and staff in organisations. Participants talked about sharing story as effective in promoting connection, respect, authenticity and reciprocity for each other.

3. The learning circle as a useful tool to engage and develop insight

¹ We surveyed conference participants about their conference experience with 4 questions: How likely they would recommend the conference; Satisfaction with the conference; Top 3 insights; Top 3 actions. 35 conference participants completed a survey.

Participants enjoyed the interactive aspect of the conference, that they were not just listening but active participants in producing knowledge. Participants believed the learning circle and focusing on being present and listening and responding was an effective way to develop knowledge, insight and relationships.
